C-Cube support for Cities in Climate Smart Cities Assessment Framework 2.0

The phase 2 of the first of its kind city assessment framework on climate parameters was launched on September 11 by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs. Climate Centre for Cities is supporting MoHUA in the implementation of this framework and has developed various city support systems for providing handholding assistance in the process.

The framework is gaining traction from both Smart Cities and Amrut/Capital Cities this year. We had 20 training workshops around the five themes of the framework in the last two weeks and over 595 city officials participated. The team at C-Cube has made 222 calls from its help desk to reach out to relevant persons in all the cities to extend support.



This enormous effort will continue through the CSCAF 2.0 implementation. 42 cities have already initiated data entry in the centralised portal and to support the ongoing process, daily interactive mentoring sessions with experts are being conducted. 10 ClimateSmart Alliance partners are providing handholding support to 61 cities. This collaborative assessment will help cities to not only identify gaps in urban challenges from the climate lens but also provide guidance to tackle climate related challenges in a step-by-step manner.


